
The Defense of Duffer's Drift Reviewed by Mike Crane

This short book was written in 1904 immediately after the Second Boer War and before World War I by Captain (later Major General Sir) Ernest Dunlop Swinton, a noted British soldier, author and professor who is credited with developing the tank during WWI. http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Ernest_Dunlop_Swinton



The book involves a hypothetical Lt. Backsight Forethought, who is charged with guarding a South African river crossing with a platoon of 50 men. The lieutenant is unexpectedly confronted with a large force of Boers who are armed with Mauser rifles, pom-pom machine guns and field guns. His tactical dilemmas are finally resolved during the course of seven consecutive dreams.
