Comments:

An excellent study of the Battle of Midway, with emphasis on planning and intelligence prior to the battle and a detailed narrative of the battle itself ó this is useful because timing was king in carrier battles ó it was a crucial decision when to launch airstrikes, in which direction and with what armament. All these complex events and timings are explained with admirable clarity. There are a number of very useful tables outlining what ships and aircraft were present on each side. The chapter on wargaming focuses on

committee games, matrix games, board games and computer games. A few books on naval wargaming are mentioned for tactical battles. The emphasis is more on strategic games, which is understandable given the distances involved but there is nothing here for the soloist.
