There is a lot of information here, ranging from forts to rifle pits. There is a sister volume (which I havenøt read) on coastal, brick and stone forts. This one concentrates on timber and earth forts, field fortifications like trenches, rifle pits and ditches, as well as things like abates, chevaux de frises and even wire entanglements. There is great variety here from the very simple to the very ambitious.
