

## **Review of Napoleonic & Civil War Military Miniatures (White): Plastic Toy Soldiers Set: Infantry, Cavalry, Artillery, Ships from Morrison Games**

Airfix and similar plastic figures have always been an affordable way to get into wargaming. However, to assemble two complete small armies you have to buy several boxes because infantry, artillery and cavalry are sold in separate sets. If you want more than one artillery piece for your armies, you will buy additional boxes. It adds up.

Being in search of cheaper approaches, I took a chance on these 15mm hard plastic figures. They were about \$12 a bag. The description says this:

- 24 infantry, 8 artillery, 8 cavalry, 8 ships
- High quality white plastic
- Napoleonic & Civil War military miniatures
- Game pieces from VIKTORY II board game
- Paintable figurines

First off, we should note that they are not Civil War. All are French Napoleonic. Four types of figures are included: ships, infantry, cannon, and cavalry. The ships are a completely different scale so I set them aside. The infantry pieces require basing because they will tip over on the battlefield.

On the positive side, paint adheres easily to the figures, and you get lots of cannon and cavalry in the same bag with the infantry. Four unit types can easily be configured. In my case, I have infantry, artillery, cavalry and skirmishers (one infantry and one cavalry on the same base).

My assessment is that an inexpensive, yet diverse army can be assembled from this product.
